Profile of skills and competences

Boatbuilders/shipwrights are able to:

- build pleasure boats and commercial vessels;
- repair, rebuild and maintain vessels;
- build models and moulds for the production of fibre-glass boats;
- work with wood, steel, aluminium and plastic-fibre reinforced polyester;
- fit out cabins, holds, engine rooms and wheel houses;
- lay up and launch boats;
- install technical equipment; and
- carry out rigging and clearing assignments.

Trained boatbuilders/shipwrights have experience in:

- Fitting out, decking and mounting;
 - Repair of wood and glass-fibre reinforced polyester;
 - Work with materials such as wood, composite materials and metal;
 - Vessel equipment; and
 - slag removal.
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Range of occupations accessible to the holder of the certificate

Trained boatbuilders carry out the following jobs:

- Work related to the building, rebuilding, repair and maintenance of pleasure boats and commercial vessels;
 - Work with wood, composite materials, paints and varnishes and the installation of technical equipment on a vessel;
 - Fitting out of cabins, holds and wheel houses;
 - Installation of technical equipment; and
 - The development and manufacture of models and moulds for fibre-glass boats.
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Duration and mode of education and training

The total duration of the education and training programme is 4 years, with 50 weeks of formal education and training and 158 weeks of on-the-job training.

Danish vocational education and training programmes are alternating programmes, which means that the education and training activities alternate between education and training at a school and on-the-job training in an enterprise.

Level of certificate

The training programme is a full vocational education and training programme, equivalent to level 3 in the Isced system (Isced 1997).

Access to the next level of education/training

The education and training described in this certificate gives access to level 4 (Isced) education and training in Denmark.

7-point grading scale

On certificates issued after 1 August 2007, the 7-point grading scale is used.

On certificates issued before 1 August 2007, the 13-point grading scale is used.

The 13-point grading scale was replaced by the 7-point scale as per that date.
